THE BUSINESS PLAN

A business plan is an important document that explains the operations and goals of your business. It is often a required document when applying for grants and loans.

The staff at the HBC can assist you in registering a corporation. **Please note:** It is recommended that you meet with a lawyer or an accountant before registering a corporation to determine if this legal structure is a good fit for you.

Licensing and Zoning

Before signing a lease or purchasing a location, you will need to determine if your business requires a municipal licence to operate and identify the zoning requirements.

Insurance

It is recommended that you **obtain multiple quotes** for your business insurance and check if you have a group or professional association discounted rate. Possible coverage includes **commercial general liability** and **professional liability**.

Canada Revenue Agency (CRA)

A Business Number is required to interact with CRA program accounts, including the GST/HST account and the payroll account. Businesses must apply for a Business Number and GST/HST account if making revenue of \$30,000 or more in a 12-month period.

If employing workers, businesses must have a business number, even if they are making under \$30,000, to register a payroll account. Corporations are assigned a Business Number upon registration, regardless of revenue or their number of employees.

RESEARCH


